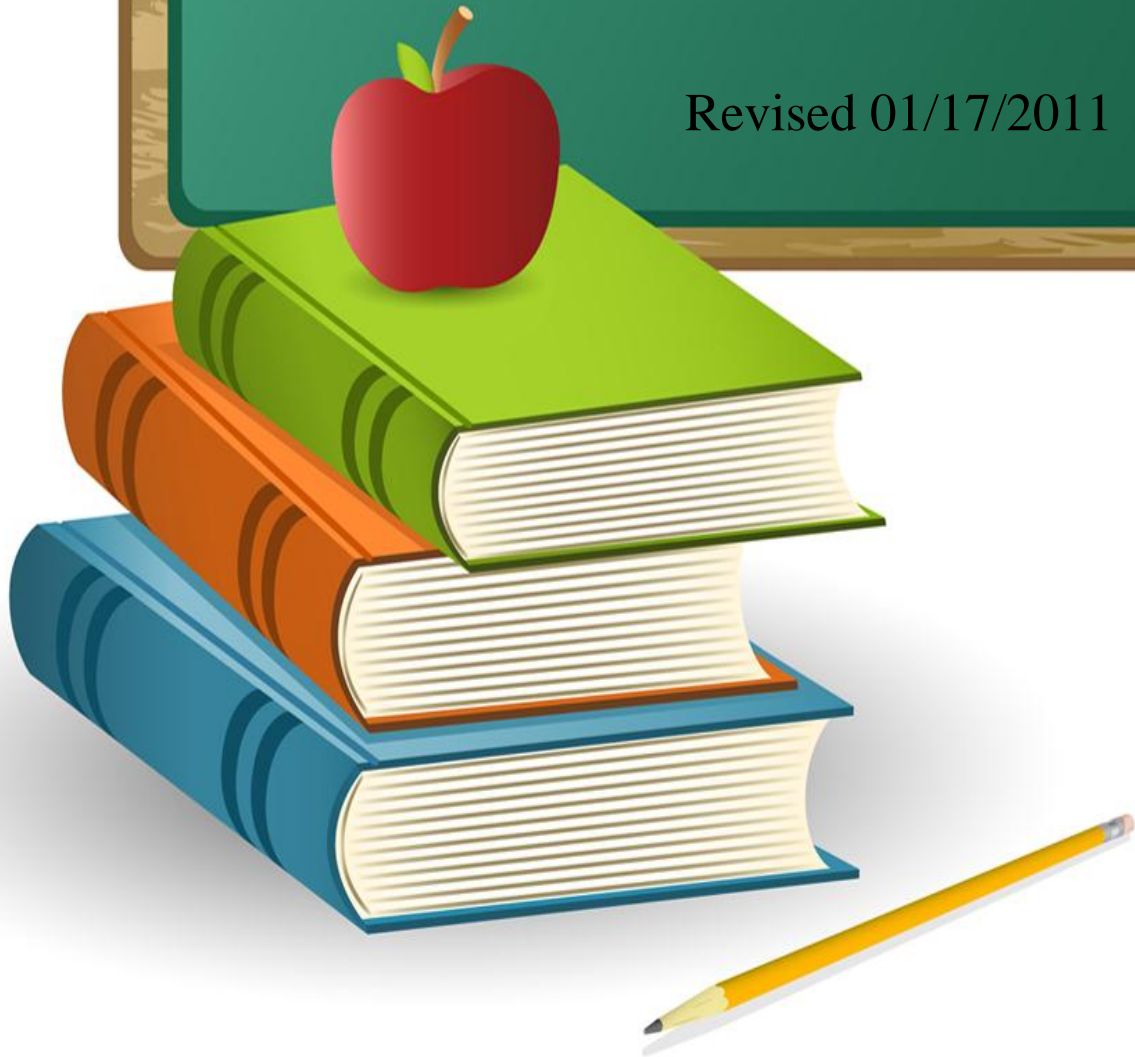

FAIRVIEW HIGH SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

(21 Credits)

A high school diploma indicates that the student has completed certain courses, which are considered so fundamental to a basic education they are **REQUIRED OF ALL STUDENTS**. These are called **REQUIRED COURSES** and are listed below. Opportunity is also given to each student to select a variety of subjects which meet his/her individual interests and abilities. These subjects are called **ELECTIVES**. To graduate from Fairview High School prior to September 15, 2013 a student must complete **21** credits of high school work. **14** of the 21 credits must be the **required courses** as specified below. The remaining **7** credits must come from **electives** that the student chooses.

For students who entered ninth grade prior to July 1, 2010, (Class of 2013 & before) and graduating prior to September 15, 2013, the requirements for graduation shall include twenty-one (21) units. The units shall be distributed as follows:

In addition to curriculum requirements, all students must also pass all five portions of the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) in the areas of Reading, Math, Writing, Science, and Social Studies to receive a diploma and participate in graduation. The only exception is for students who, through the direction of an IEP, complete an alternate assessment.

High school students first attempt the OGT's in the spring of their 10th grade year. Additional attempts are available during October and March of the junior and senior years as needed. Optional summer remediation and testing may be available. Please contact the high school guidance office if you have questions regarding the state testing requirements for graduation.

Ohio Core Diploma Credit Requirements

To graduate from Fairview High School after September 15, 2013 a student must complete **21** credits of high school work. **15** of the 21 credits must be the **required courses** as specified below. The remaining **6** credits must come from **electives** that the student chooses.

Beginning with students who enter ninth grade for the first time **on or after July 1, 2010**, (Class of 2014 & after) and graduating after September 15, 2013, the requirements for graduation shall include twenty-one (21) units. The units shall be distributed as follows:

Fine Arts		Two (2) semesters of fine arts (Art, Chorus, Band) completed before graduation. The course work can be completed in any of grades 7 – 12.

In addition to curriculum requirements, all students must also pass all five portions of the Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) in the areas of Reading, Math, Writing, Science, and Social Studies to receive a diploma and participate in graduation. The only exception is for students who, through the direction of an IEP, complete an alternate assessment.

Fairview also offers many Educational Options available to our students beyond the basic high school curriculum. These include:

- Honors courses in Chemistry II, English 11, English 12, and Calculus, with the Advanced Placement testing option. College credit may be earned if student achieves the qualifying level on the AP exam.
- Four County Career Center offers a variety of Vocational and Tech Prep programs for juniors and seniors.
- Teacher Training Program for Seniors only. This is a ½ day program housed at Defiance College to gain field experience in education. Students would complete ½ day academics at Fairview.
- Post Secondary Enrollment Option allows qualified students to take college course work. Students participating in PSEO must maintain a full-time status.
- Credit Flexibility Option allows qualified students to complete coursework for initial credit through non-traditional means
- Summer school through Four County Career Center is available for students who are deficient in credits.
- The Opportunity Center is an alternative education program available for some students who are deficient in credits.
- On-line credit recovery programs are available for students who are deficient in credits

Discuss your course selections and four-year educational plans with your parents, teachers, and counselor.

You should make it a practice to review your plans and courses annually to see that they are leading toward your goals. If one of your goals is to attend a 4 year college or university, admission information has been included below for your review. COLLEGE ENTRANCE (4 YEAR INSTITUTION)

Many Ohio colleges have adopted the following requirements for unconditional admission:

- 4 Credits English
- 4 Credits Mathematics including Algebra I, II, Geometry
- 3 Credits of Natural Science
- 3 Credits of Social Studies
